AMERICANS WITH DISABILITIES ACT TRANSITION PLAN**

Mundelein Parks Looks to Community to Get Best Use of Facilities and Programs

Mundelein and community residents: Share your input about our recently updated **Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Transition Plan** and help the Mundelein Park District put together the best ways for all visitors to use our facilities and programs.

The ADA Transition Plan is a comprehensive plan based on a review of all parks and facilities of the Mundelein Park & Recreation District (MPRD). MPRD is located in north-central Lake County and serves a diverse population of over 35,000 with year-round programs, and education and recreational opportunities for all ages and interests.

The reviews for the plan were conducted by **Recreation Accessibility Consultants** (www.rac-llc.com) of Hoffman Estates. The purpose of the plan is to address any barriers MPRD may have that prevent a person with a disability from using facilities or programs.

Action on the plan will be taken at the July 25 Park District Board Meeting. Those wishing to share input can do so by attending either the **July 11** or **July 25** meeting. Meetings begin at 7:30 p.m. and are held at the **Mundelein Community Center** (third floor), 1401 N. Midlothian Road, Mundelein. At the meetings, participants will have an opportunity to review the plan and ask questions. About the Mundelein Park & Recreation District (MPRD)

More than 785 acres make up the Mundelein Park & Recreation District, including 33 parks for hiking and biking, 20 tennis courts, 23 playgrounds, picnic shelters, and more. Conveniently located in north-central Lake County, MPRD serves a growing population of more than 35,000 residents with year-round programs, and education and recreational opportunities for all ages and interests. Facilities include the award-winning, 18-hole Ken Killian-designed Steeple Chase Golf Club, a multi-function Community Center, Park View Health & Fitness Center, Diamond Lake Beach, for swimming, boating and picnicking, Barefoot Bay Family Aquatic Center, with 33-foot high water slides and a relaxing “lazy river,” Spray Park, a special area for young ones with oversized, water-spraying “flowers,” the Regent Center, the activity hub for active adults, Fort Hill Heritage Museum, for a history of Mundelein, and Diamond Lake Sports Complex, a nature and recreational destination for all ages.
